



## PET PERMISSION FORM

Under most tenancy agreements and leases, you will need to get our written consent before keeping any pets, eg dogs, cats, reptiles or birds in your home. We will not refuse permission unreasonably, however it is unlikely we will grant this where requests are made to keep a dog in a flat or other property which does not have the sole use of a garden. We will take the number of existing pets in the property and the type and size of the property into account when making a decision.

You must remove any pet which causes a nuisance or damages your home or any shared area. If we give permission, we may withdraw it by giving you one week's written notice if the pet is causing a nuisance or damage.

You must not keep livestock or unlicensed or illegal exotic or wild animals in the property (including any garden provided).
